Council

Commission

On 17 January, the Commission published the Recommendation (EU) 2024/214 of 10 January 2024 on guidelines setting out the methodology for data gathering and processing for the preparation of the annual report

on the control of exports, brokering, technical assistance, transit and transfer of dual-use items pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2021/821 of the European Parliament and of the Council. Available here.

On 10 February, France published a decree amending Decree 2011-1192 to incorporate amendments mandated by the EU dual-use Regulation; available here (in French). Additionally, a decree was issued imposing export controls on quantum computers, advanced electronic components, and semiconductors; available here (in French).

Netherlands

The Netherlands has published a "Non-paper for improved EU coordination on export controls" particularly in light of the White Paper on Export Controls which was presented on 24 January. Available here.



Australia

On 27 March, the Defence Trade Controls Amendment Bill 2024 finally passed both Houses. The Bill amends the Defence Trade Controls Act 2012 to regulate the supply of certain military or dual-use goods and technology on the Defence and Strategic Goods List from Australia to certain foreign persons both within and outside of Australia, among other provisions. United Kingdom

On 28 March, a revised open general export licence for the export of dual-use items to EU member states was uploaded. Available <u>here</u>.

On 12 March, the ECJU amended the Export Control Order 2008 and Council Regulation (EC) No 428/2009 (Recast) pursuant to the Export Control (Amendment) Regulations 2024. These Regulations will amend Schedules 2 and 3 of the 2008 Order, as well as Annex I of the Retained Dual-Use Regulation. Available here.

On 19 January, the ECJU amended the licence authorising the importation for transhipment and the subsequent exportation of certain goods to allowed destinations. Available here.

United States

On 21 March, the BIS published the final rules that make changes to the end-user controls of the EAR to add end-user controls, and in certain cases expand existing end-user controls, on certain persons identified on the List of Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons (SDN List) maintained by the OFAC. Available here.

On 8 March, the BIS amended the EAR by revising license requirements for certain cameras, systems, and related components. Available here.

On 6 March, the US Departments of Treasury, Commerce, and Justice published a Tri-Seal Compliance Note on the obligations of foreign-based persons to comply with U.S. sanctions and export control laws. Available here.

On 23 January, the BIS streghtened its existing controls under the EAR against Russia and Belarus in response to

Russia's continued war against Ukraine and Belaru's complicity in the invasion. Available here.
