LEGAL DEVELOPMENTS: EUROPEAN UNION

Commission

The Delegated Regulation (EU) 2025/2003, which amends Regulation (EU) 2021/821 with regard to the list of dual-use items, came into force on 15 November. Available [here](#).

Council

On 23 October, the EU adopted the 19th package of sanctions against Russia (which include dual-use items related measures). Available [here](#).

On 13 October, the Council announced the decision to prolong the application of individual restrictive measures against the proliferation and use of chemical weapons by another year, until 16 October 2026. Available [here](#).



LEGAL DEVELOPMENTS: INTERNATIONAL

Canada

On 5 November, Canada published the Notice to exporters no 1159, on the movement to and storage of controlled technology in the Cloud, codifying Canada positions on controlled technology and cloud computing. Available [here](#).

China

In November, China announced to impose new export licensing requirements for certain precursor chemicals destined for the United States, Mexico, and Canada. The rule took effect immediately. Available [here](#).

Israel

On 18 November, the Minister of Defense signed an order to repeal the "Encryption Order" (the Control of Commodities and Services (Engagement in Encryption Items) Order, 1974). This order introduced changes to the export of items with encryption and/or decryption capabilities. The repeal will take effect on 21 March 2026. Available (in Hebrew) [here](#).

Japan

On 11 November, the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry published the "Cabinet Decision on the Cabinet Order to Partially Amend the Export Trade Control Order". It concerns the revision of the list of export goods, the elimination of overlaps with export controls under other laws, and the addition of exceptional cases that do not require export license. New Zealand

On 30 October, New Zealand introduced new national controls on exports in response to emerging technology. The updated list includes national controls on certain dual use technologies: materials processing; electronics; and computers. Available [here](#).

United Kingdom

On 16 December, the ECJU updated the consolidated list of strategic military and dual-use items that require export authorisation. Available [here](#).

On 16 December, the ECJU published updates on open general export licences (regarding: export of dual-use items to EU member states; technology for dual-use items; export of dual-use items after exhibition; export for repair/replacement under warranty; export after repair/replacement under warranty; dual-use items India). On 7 November, the ECJU published the Export Control (Amendment) (No.2) Regulations 2025 (since December into force). Available [here](#).

On 29 October, the ECJU published the notice advising of the UK arms embargo on Armenia and Azerbaijan which ceased to be in force as of 13 October 2025. Available [here](#).

On 2 October, the ECJU updated the (AUKUS) open general licence which permits, subject to certain conditions, the export of dual-use items or military goods software or technology and trade of military goods, to, between and among Australia, the USA and the UK. Available [here](#).

United States

On 11 December, the BIS imposed a one-year suspension of the interim final rule, “Expansion of End-User Controls to Cover Affiliates of Certain Listed Entities”. The suspension is set to end November 9, 2026, absent a future extension. Available [here](#).

On 28 October, the House of Representatives introduced Bill (HR 5853) to strengthen enforcement of US export control laws and increase civil penalties under Export Control Reform Act of 2018. Available [here](#).

On 9 October, the BIS amended the EAR by adding 29 entries (26 entities and 3 addresses) to the Entity List under the destinations of People's Republic of China (China) (19), Turkey (9), and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) (1). Available [here](#).
